- 1. This invitation for bids follows the General Procurement Notice (GPN) for this project that appeared in UNDB online on **April 16, 2015**.
- 2. The Republic of Serbia Republic Geodetic Authority (RGZ) has received a loan from the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development toward the cost of the Real Estate Management Project, and it intends to apply part of the proceeds of this loan to payments under the agreement(s) resulting from this IFB: Procurement of IT equipment for: Digital archive, Mass Property Valuation, object vectorization from satellite images, AGROS center and servers for National Geoportal, IFB No.: SRB-REMP-8486YF-NCB-G-18-098.
- 3. The Project Implementation Unit (PIU) of Republic Geodetic Authority serves as the implementing agency for the project and now invites sealed bids from eligible Bidders for Procurement of IT equipment for: Digital archive, Mass Property Valuation, object vectorization from satellite images, AGROS center and servers for National Geoportal. The purpose is:
  - Expansion of capacity of servers and storage systems in Republic Geodetic Authority (RGA);
  - Enhancement of reliability of RGZ IT system;
  - Improvement of data integrity and availability of data and services;
  - Capacity increase of device that can transform analog document (paper) to its digital representation (represented as image) in RGA through procurement of photo cameras, flat, ADF and A0 scanners,
  - Improvement of communication network in RGZ through procurement of router and switches.

Delivery, installation and testing of the equipment are included in the scope of the work as well as support capabilities in warranty period.

4. Bidding will be conducted through the national competitive bidding procedures specified in the World Bank's Guidelines: Procurement of Goods, Works, and Non-Consulting Services under IBRD Loans and IDA Credits & Grants, by World Bank Borrowers, issued in January 2011, revised in July 2014, and is `open to all Bidders from eligible as defined in these Guidelines, that meet the following minimum qualification criteria:

(i) During the past three (3) years, the Bidder must have completed at least one (1) successful contract regarding delivery and implementation of IT equipment with minimum value of 1 million EUR. To prove this, bidder must submit original statement, signed by the client, with requested information.

(ii) During the past five (5) years, the Bidder must have completed three (3) successful contracts with a minimum of three servers and/or storage delivered and integrated in an IT infrastructure. To prove this, bidder must submit original statement, signed by the client, with requested information.

(iii) The minimum required annual average turnover over the previous five (5) years must be EURO 2,000,000.00 calculated at official exchange rate of National Bank of Serbia at the end of each respective year. To prove this, bidder must submit balance sheets/audited financial statements certified by a registered accountant.

(iv) The successful bidder must have the following support capabilities, during warranty period, or must demonstrate in the bid documentation a credible plan for establishing such capabilities by the contract signing:

o Help-Desk telephone service with automatic problems application must be active 24 hours, every day.

o For problems that cannot be resolved by telephone that are notified within 8:00am-8:00pm Monday through Sunday, qualified service personnel must be able to arrive on-site within 24 hours of problem escalation.

(v) Manufacturer's Authorizations for Information Technologies - except for those technologies which the Bidder itself manufactures - are required for the following types/categories: Servers, Desktops, Laptops, Active network equipment and Photo equipment.

- 5. Interested eligible Bidders may obtain further information from the Project Implementation Unit of Republic Geodetic Authority and inspect the bidding documents at the address given below from 09:00 to 15:00 hours.
- 6. A complete set of bidding documents, available in English only, may be purchased by interested bidders on the submission of a written application to the address below and upon payment of a nonrefundable fee EUR 150.00 or equivalent in Serbian Dinars based on the selling exchange rate published by the National Bank of Serbia on the date of payment.

All bids must be secured by a bid security of **EUR 18,000.00** or an equivalent amount in a freely convertible currency. Late bids will be rejected. Bids will be opened in the presence of the Bidders' representatives who choose to attend at the address below at 12:30 local time on **August 27, 2018**, in the PIU premises at the mezzanine.
- 8. The attention of prospective Bidders is drawn to (i) the fact that they will be required to certify in their bids that all software is either covered by a valid license or was produced by the Bidder and (ii) that violations are considered fraud, which can result in ineligibility to be awarded World Bank-financed contracts.

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
